

Certificate in Global Engagement: Global Engagement Course Submissions

One of the avenues in which the **QEP: Global Baylor** seeks to develop greater student awareness and engagement pertaining to global challenges is to provide students the opportunity to earn a <u>Certificate in Global Engagement</u>. This certificate incorporates a balance of curricular and co-curricular requirements and is available to students of all majors seeking to enrich their academic experience. Successful completion of the certificate program will be noted on student transcripts.

One element of the *Certificate in Global Engagement* is student enrollment in Baylor courses at the 3000-4000 level that incorporate exploration and engagement in a specific disciplinary or transdisciplinary context. Courses that are **Global Baylor** approved will include these **three** elements:

- 1.) The course investigates today's world through relevant study of 20th and/or 21st Century global topics.
- 2.) The course includes three or more of the criteria outlined below;
 - A. Explores one or more regions of the world—including, for example, social, religious, educational, economic, political, or other aspects of that region.
 - B. Compares and contrasts cultures/ countries/peoples explicitly for the purpose of developing cultural competencies and understanding through readings, writing, projects, discussion and reflection.
 - C. Draws student's attention to global challenges, such as ethical or moral challenges, justice, health, the environment, etc.
 - D. Engages students to evaluate and choose individual and group actions that can be taken on local, state, regional, national and global scale to contribute to the creation of a better world for all God's people.
 - E. Challenges students to examine and better comprehend their own "culture" or worldview.
- 3.) 25% or more of course requirements/time are aligned with those criteria.

For a course to be considered, the course must be submitted to our Faculty Advisory Board by either the instructor of record, Department Chair, or Dean.
