What type of Study Abroad experience does the student plan to pursue?
Option I – Baylor Faculty Programs (short term)
Baylor University offers a selection of 30 different Baylor Faculty Programs in over two dozen countries every Summer and Winter. These programs can last 2 to 6 weeks and are taught by a Baylor faculty member. Students will register for 1 (Winter) or 2 (Summer) Baylor class(es) that is a requirement the study abroad program. Program availability varies, acceptance is competitive.
Option II – Baylor Faculty Programs (semester)
Baylor University offers semester long Baylor Faculty Programs every Fall, Spring, and Summer. These programs can last anywhere from 90 to 180 days with campuses located in Ireland, the Netherlands, London, and Scotland. Students will be registered full time taking 1-2 courses taught by a Baylor faculty and 3-4 courses taught by the faculty of their host university. Program availability varies, acceptance is competitive.
Option III – Baylor Partner Programs
Baylor University has 107 universities in over 45 different countries for students to study at for one to two semesters, or a summer or winter term, through partner university relationships. Traveling to one of Baylor's partner universities is a prestigious opportunity available to undergraduate students of any major or minor. This type of study abroad program offers students semester-long, year-long, winter, and summer opportunities abroad. Placements depend on space.
Option IV – Internship / Research
Baylor offers a range of internship abroad opportunities. Internships abroad are customized to support a student's career goals and provide experiences of living and working abroad. Some of Baylor's semester study abroad programs include an internship as part of the course load. Internship placements are not guaranteed and can be competitive.
